

EXECUTIVE ORDER 12-03

WHEREAS, K.S.A. 48-925(b) provides that the Governor may issue orders and proclamations which shall have the enforce and effect of law during the period of a state disaster declared under subsection (b) of K.S.A. 48-924; and

WHEREAS, AT 10:20 p.m. on the twenty-eighth day of February, 2012, I declared a state of emergency for Wabaunsee county as a result of the tornado which struck, causing personal injury and damage to businesses and homes; and

WHEREAS, victims of this natural disaster may be prevented, hindered or delayed from coping with the affects of the disaster by State regulatory provisions governing the issuance of duplicate birth and marriage certificates;


NOW, THEREFORE, pursuant to the authority vested in me as the Governor of the State of Kansas, I hereby suspend the provisions of the regulatory statutes, rules and/or regulations prescribing the requirement for fee assessments to obtain duplicate birth and marriage certificates for victims of the February 28, 2012, natural disaster.

This document shall be filed with the Secretary of State as Executive Order 12-03, and shall become effective immediately.
