E/L0101 Foundations of Emergency Management *National Emergency Management Basic Academy*

The Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) recognizes the need to tie training programs to an established set of emergency management competencies and to a career development program through a progressive training and education system that includes the entry-level Academy, called the National Emergency Management Basic Academy. Training objectives for this course, *Foundations of Emergency Management*, are based on the newly established Emergency Management competencies that the National Emergency Management Association (NEMA); the International Association of Emergency Managers (IAEM); and local, State, territorial, and tribal emergency management professionals have established in coordination with the Emergency Management Institute (EMI).

Topics Covered

Legal issues; intergovernmental and interagency context; influencing, organizing, social vulnerability issues; managing stress; collaboration, preparedness; team building; mitigation; response; prevention and protection; ethical decision-making; recovery; technology; administration; and the future of emergency management.

Target Audience

This course is intended for newly appointed emergency managers from State, local, tribal, territorial, and Federal emergency management agencies, and prospective professionals transferring from another discipline to emergency management.

Required Prerequisites

- IS-100—*Introduction to the Incident Command System (ICS)*
- IS230.d—*Fundamentals of Emergency Management*
- IS-700—*National Incident Management system (NIMS), An Introduction*
- IS-800.b—*Fundamentals of Emergency Management*
