

## Section 313 - Toxics Release Inventory Reporting

A business must meet **ALL** of the following criteria for any particular year to be subject to EPCRA TRI requirements:

- The facility is in one of the covered industries:
  - Manufacturing
  - Federal Facilities
  - Metal and Coal Mining
  - Electric Utilities (burning coal and/or oil for commercial distribution)
  - Commercial Hazardous Waste Treatment facilities (regulated under RCRA Subtitle C)
  - Chemical and Allied Products - Wholesale
  - Petroleum Bulk Terminals and Plants
  - Solvent Recovery Services (fee or contract basis)
- The facility manufactured (including imported) or processed or otherwise used a toxic chemical in excess of the threshold quantity during the calendar year.
- Threshold quantities that trigger reporting are 25,000 pounds manufactured or processed or 10,000 pounds otherwise used, except for certain Persistent Bioaccumulative Toxic (PBT) Chemicals. The threshold for the PBT chemicals was lowered to 100 pounds or less depending on the chemical beginning with the 2000 reporting year. EPA offers a [TRI Threshold Determination Tool](#) to help facilities determine if they meet the threshold requirements for reporting to TRI. This audio visual tool will take approximately 6 to 8 minutes.

### Notice To TRI Reporters

The EPA has amended 40 CFR Part 372 to include the North American Industry Classification System (NAICS) codes. Facilities are now required to use NAICS codes on Form R reports and Form A Certification Statements.
